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Lydiate Learning Trust Gender Pay Gap Report 2023

Lydiate Learning Trust is required by law to carry out Gender Pay Reporting under the Equality Act 2010 (Gender Pay Gap Information) Regulations 2017. The overall gender pay gap is defined as the difference between the mean (average) or median (actual midpoint) hourly rate of pay of male and female employees.

At the snapshot date of 31st March 2023, the Trust has 367 employees who count as full pay relevant employees (the definition used for reporting gender pay). There are 262 females (71%) and 105 males (29%).

The results of the statutory calculations are:

1. Mean Pay Gap

The difference between the mean hourly rate of pay that male and female full pay relevant employees receive is -0.7%. This has reduced from 5.1% in Mar-22, 8.7% in Mar-21 and 14.5% in Mar-20.

2. Median Pay Gap

The difference between the median hourly rate of pay that male and female full pay relevant employees receive is 3.2%. This has reduced from 24.8% in Mar-22, 25.2% in Mar-21 and 13.4% in Mar-20.

3. Mean and Median Bonus Pay Gap

No bonuses were paid to any member of staff for the reporting period.

In all cases females represent the higher percentage.
