Stephen is currently a Lecturer at the Open University, leading on the development of a new in-service qualification for Police organisations. He is currently researching work-based learning and assessment methodologies within this work.

Previously, he was Head of Academic Programmes (Policing Studies) at Liverpool John Moores University, leading the provision of the Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes while also lecturing in the areas of 'Investigation' and 'General Police Duties'. In that role Stephen contributed both nationally and locally to the development of policy under the emerging Police Professionalisation agenda.

He has worked with both Oxford University Press and Pearson Publishing developing educational materials and has worked with Skills for Justice and the College of Policing, developing and assessing NVQ qualifications, and Apprenticeship standards and end point assessments. He is a Senior Fellow of the Higher Education Academy and a Fellow of the Higher Education Leadership Foundation.
